The First Universalist Church of Yarmouth is a self-funded and self-governed volunteer organization supported in our mission by a fulltime minister and part-time staff.

We are an open-minded and open-hearted spiritual community of people who lead lives of justice, love, learning, and hope. Our church and our faith include people of every ethnicity, race, age, social background, ability, political affiliation, family structure, gender identity, and sexual/romantic orientation. As Unitarian Universalists, we are not interested in creeds and commitments of faith, but in right relations with one another and holistic ways of living on and with our planet. We welcome all who embrace our shared values.

We are a certified welcoming congregation and have voted to endorse the spirit of the 8th principle. We are a member of the New England Region and an honor congregation with the Unitarian Universalist Association.

A Shared Ministry

First Universalist is a church of shared ministry where the Minister and the Board of Trustees are each responsible for parts of congregational life. Our Minister oversees and is responsible for worship, pastoral care, religious education, and social justice engagement. There are four councils who assist the minister in these programs. Minister's Report



What I LOVED this Church Year

Well my friends, though not without some memorable challenges, this year, there was certainly much to love. First and foremost I loved celebrating worship in person with you. Maybe one day the memory of Covid lockdown will truly fade away, but right now I take nothing about our congregational life for granted. From the big all-encompassing experiences of sitting next to each other, seeing your whole faces, and rising up singing side by side each week, to the smaller often overlooked details of simply sharing microphones, passing the offering basket, and chatting over a cup of coffee, it feels pretty miraculous to practice our faith in person together - not to mention spirit lifting and nourishing.

I also loved our emphasis on love this year! Though we were the target of a hate group in December, I celebrate that their animosity only emboldened the love that exists at the center of our faith, the center of our community, and at the center of each one of us. An oft evoked Universalist teaching is that we are called to "love the hell out of this world," and friends, I'd say we did just that this year. Through our month of Radical Acts of Loving Kindness, our "Love at the Center" Annual Campaign, the more than \$12,000 we gave to local justice organizations with our half plates and farm suppers, the re-establishment of our Hearts & Hands caregiving group, and the myriad ways we served the broader community through legislative advocacy, asylum seeker support, Our Whole Lives courses, Pride participation, and our overall welcoming and affirming spirit - we truly met hate with love. I don't know about you, but I loved it.

What I LONG FOR

Oh, I longed for the usual things - an end to covid, a turn of heart and new hobby for white supremacists, a moratorium on Sunday morning youth sports, a quick and easy solution to the housing, environmental, gun, and democratic crises at hand . . . But beyond these hopeful yearnings, I longed for the same thing I long every year: more time spent with you. I long to get to know you all better, to learn about your daily lives, experiences, passions, theologies - and find inroads for you to share your gifts, interests, questions, and your longings with our congregation.

What I LONG FOR

I think this might just be the perennial longing of ministry - a longing that is always steadily being eased, while simultaneously unfolding and expanding as our community evolves, grows, shifts, ebbs and flows.

Simply put though, I long for you to feel at ease and welcome here to participate, lead, join, suggest, create, and of course, just be. Our Sunday services are very important to our congregational life, but that hour or so together each week is just one aspect of all that we do and can do together. I long to explore all the possibilities of "church" with you. I hope I always feel this way and that you experience this longing too so we can keep on movin' forward together exploring, embracing, and engaging.

What I want to LIFT UP

At the close of this church year, I lift up the members of our Councils and Committees, and our Board of Trustees. At First Universalist our shared ministry model is incredibly important to me - honestly I can't imagine the alternative! We are all in this together because we must be. Our church is a church of the people and of the living tradition. No one person can define nor direct this spiritual life we share. The folks who give their hearts, minds, hands - and often culinary expertise! - to Faith in Action, Worship Council, Adult & Children's RE, the Committee on Ministry, Buildings & Grounds, Leadership Development, Stewardship, Congregation Connections, and the Board are not only indispensable to the life of our church - they enliven our church and make possible the ministry we and I have to offer. Thank you, Lay Leaders!

I must also lift up our Tech Crew - Jennifer Caven, Charlie Horstman, Joanna Landsman and Pete Titcomb who show up on a weekly basis and beam our services out to friends near and far who are unable to join us in our sanctuary. Our Tech crew also is in charge of sound, a/v set-up, recording and posting our services each week. Where would we be without them!?

As we approach the polishing up and presentation of a new five-year plan, we also give thanks for the work of those who came before us and gave us a plan to fulfill. I am filled with gratitude for everyone who shows up, and everyone who works behind the scenes. I am in awe of the consistently faithful work of our minister and staff, and dazzled by their kind and creative responses to our many opportunities and challenges. A heartfelt thanks to one and all! I'd like to highlight the following specific areas of our work. There's so much more than these few bullets (which I am sure you will read about in all the Council and Committee Reports) but wow, isn't it amazing how much you can get done with coffee, pie, candles, and love?

What I LOVED this Church Year

- **The spirit of this Board!** Open-minded, kind, and mission-driven. At the end of a Board meeting, I often reflect on the generous and thoughtful processing. Everyone contributes, and we find our way together.
- We had a successful (I mean really really good) Annual Campaign which even incorporated and embraced the new draft Article II Values of Justice, Generosity, Transformation, Interdependence, Equity, and Pluralism, all CENTERED IN LOVE. We called the AC "love at the center" and it became a common heartbeat of compassion and care for all. We gathered enough commitments to fully fund the compensation packages and programming costs for the coming year. In these times this was completely amazing.
- The **councils and committees** also had fantastic years. Our Board liaisons had a lot to keep track of, and the councils and committees were busy handling, creating, imagining, fixing, providing, at a whole new pace. Gwen and Andrea stayed on top of the website, the calendar, the Order of Worship, Channels, Wednesday emails and the Sunday Morning News. And yet I think it all worked. Post-covid which hasn't been very long- this was the most amazing and healthy year I've seen at First Universalist in a very long time. When I look back on the structural and systems we've put in place I think, hey nothing's perfect but this works. This is sustainable.

What I LONG FOR in the Future

- We had a brilliant and sensible ad hoc group step forward to review and rewrite our Safe Congregation Plan. Thank you to Steve, Dale, Wolfgang, Barbara, and Deb! Now it's time for implementation. We must find our way through safety training, grant applications, historic preservation reviews, coordination with local responders, making sure the VNS is safe, making physical and system changes... It's a lot. May a way be found and the courage to take it, step by step.
- Thanks to gentle messages from Rev. Hillary as well as from her peers with substack blog posts about the endlessness of congregational ministry, we have been awakened to the impossible intensity of the work. To respond, to take care of, to sort out. And then there is the running of the place! As if a minister could or even should do it all, and somehow hold healthy boundaries. A Lay Pastoral Care system will never take the place of our minister in a crisis or spiritual passages, but a trained team could support the minister/ministry with visits and conversations, and keep us all in good operating condition.
- A special warm little spotlight for the re-birth of our caring network, now known as Hearts and Hands. We are ready to provide meals, rides, visits, all kinds of support. OK here is the "long for" wish: Nobody wants to call for help when the day comes that help is needed. It's understandable. I SO personally understand! We are trained to tough it out. And yet... it's so funny... we all really want to help others! Uh-oh. Where is this disconnect coming from, and how can we as a church family and culture grow our capacity to receive, so it's as huge as our ability and longing to give? Work for the healing heart. Let's find ways to practice 'from thee I receive.'

What I am LOOKING FORWARD TO Next Church Year

• Renewed stewardship! Not just financial but ACTIONS. Now that we are 'back' (yay) we are renewing our stewardship and care for the building. We are asking a lot of it. We want to ask more! Last year we decided to hire a contractor for cleaning. We have questions about how successful that is. We ask a lot of our office assistant and bookkeeping support Andrea. We ask a lot of Gwen and so much from Hillary. Growing volunteer ownership of SOME of the many tasks and jobs would lighten the load. I envision the Board asking Councils and Committees to learn more of what Gwen and Andrea do and consider how they can possibly share some of the tasks.

What I am LOOKING FORWARD TO Next Church Year

- Our Vision Plan (9 months gestation, at least!) will be born later this year. Honestly during the shut-down times of the pandemic, it was very very hard to imagine creating a Plan. The Board put it off and put it off during those months, and sometimes whimpered that maybe we were fine as is. Intuitively, we were right about it not being the right time, but we didn't know it! This spring, with a Sanctuary full of new faces and hoping hearts, we let ourselves dream and imagine. It was time. Now we will take all the input and weave it into a bright vision for the next five years.
- A growing and vibrant intergenerational church community is possible for us! Rev. Hillary and Gwen and all those who help them and make plans for children and youth engagement have created a terrific safe, fun, and accessible RE program. Our Vision Plan makes growth and all-ages the highest priority, with many specific (and delightful) ideas for how to get there. We are ALL IN on this!

What I want to LIFT UP

- **Shared ministry** so many ways to do it! Our worship services are so often a blend of voices, beautifully coordinated by Rev. Hillary. We rose up to opportunities to serve in the community, such as the State Street Shelter. We grew the Small Group Ministry circles which are essential to our connections and create a place to honor all of our large or small life moments and passages.
- Amazing new membership! Newcomers are welcomed in multiple ways as they arrive, and then if steadily attending, they are invited to consider Membership via a three-part class called "Path to Membership". Rev. Hillary, Gwen Matthews, the Congregation Connections Committee and the Board work together (there's more shared ministry right there!) to make the course fun and meaningful. This year we have offered the class in both fall and spring, and have been deeply moved by the new members who have become part of First Universalist. Real Joy and Justice people! Generous and kind. Welcome, everyone. We are glad you are here.
- I lift up how we are –and who we are–when times are scary or complicated. Our collective response to being targeted by hateful Neo-nazi emails and social media, even as we endured a serious Covid outbreak, was to process the fear, to hold safe space, and to keep on being brave kind unstoppable UU's who explore-embrace-engage with love at the center. **How we care for each other,** even as we do our own work and reach out to the world really matters. People, First Universalist is a true sanctuary.

What I want to LIFT UP

 ONE MORE! I have to lift up the many years of whole-hearted service on the Board by Nancy Dix, Andrew Tonks, Stew Guernsey, and especially Joanna Landsman who held us together through dark times and complicated transitions with grace, patience, humor, discretion, kindness and the steadiest of voices. You will be missed more than you know. Thank you for blessing us with so much of your goodness. We'll be seeing you, I sure hope, in all the old familiar places.
